
June Seabrook Park Re-Opening 2020 Phase 2

Town Manager – June 12, 2020



Introduction

The Seabrook Board of Selectmen opened Seabrook's parks and playgrounds on June 6 in accordance with guidelines issued by the Governor's re-opening task force. The task force has updated that guidance, and this new Seabrook policy reflects and incorporates those changes.

Re-opening Seabrook Parks Phase Two

The general policy guidelines recommended to the Board for Parks reopening:

1. An initial "resident only" rule for Seabrook Parks and playgrounds.
2. For organized activities please refer to "Stay at Home Version 2.0 Amateur and Youth Sports Phase 2."

In order to meet the policy guidelines set above the following recommendations are made.

1. For public use there shall be proper social distancing, and no informal sporting events that exceed the limits issued via the "amateur and youth sports phase 2" guidance issued by the Governor, and appended to this document. There shall be no congregating, and the public is encouraged to "keep moving" during park usage. Park and playground use for the public is restricted to Seabrook residents only.
2. In accordance with the Governor's policy Seabrook affiliated teams may schedule practices and games in accordance with the guidance issued by the State. Such field scheduling shall be through the DPW.
3. Any Seabrook affiliated teams seeking to schedule practices or games shall certify that all requirements of the policy will be adhered to, including the designation of a "safety officer," who shall be named in the certification. and shall include the signing of waivers and the providing of rosters. This waiver form shall be drawn by the Recreation Department. Signed forms shall be collected by the Recreation Department.
4. Bathrooms shall be opened.

The Board, through the adoption of this policy, authorizes the continued use of Seabrook Parks and playgrounds under the terms and conditions of the Stay at Home Version 2.0 Amateur and Youth Sports Phase 2 guidance issued by the State of New Hampshire, and appended to this document .
